Job Summary:

In alignment with YCCBC values, the Community Climate Action Mobilizer is responsible for performing day-to-day tasks across various community climate and environmental projects associated with the partnership between YCCBC and City of Kamloops. The Mobilizers contribute to creating a safe, inclusive, and supportive work environment and work closely with the Co-Leads and cohort to achieve

program objectives. This position will provide a variety of exciting opportunities to participate in community climate action related initiatives to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and increase community connections and resiliency. Opportunities may include delivering community-based climate engagement and education initiatives, reducing wildfire risk, supporting active transportation through bike valet services, building and maintaining sustainable off-road trail networks and supporting local climate emergency preparedness and response efforts.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Participate in and actively engage with initial and ongoing training sessions led by YCCBC, Co-Leads, and project partners.
- Work alongside team members and community partners to advance local climate initiatives and community priorities through diverse tasks and responsibilities.
- Be open to learning new things, trying new things, and challenging yourself to grow.
- Assist with coordinating and preparing worksite logistics.
- Complete assigned tasks safely, efficiently, and with a focus on meeting project goals.
- Support the program Co-Leads in collecting data and compiling information for project reports.
- Contribute to building a team culture of safety, inclusion, and belonging.
- Contribute to social media promotional events and activities.
- Collaborate with the Co-Leads to identify and address challenges, working toward effective solutions.
- Respect and follow the processes outlined in the Collective Agreement, and engage with union representatives as needed regarding workplace questions

or concerns.

- Positively represent YCCBC and its partner organizations when engaging with the community.

Working Conditions

- Various job sites that will include working outdoors in a variety of weather conditions and physical labour.
- Occasional work from a home office

Qualifications:

No 'formal' post-secondary education is required, as we recognize that 'formal' education at colleges and universities is just one version of many types of meaningful education.

- Must be between 17 and 30 years old at the start of the position.
- Reside in Kamloops (relocation assistance is not provided).
- Personal values and commitment to climate action, social justice, anti-racism, anti-oppression, diversity, inclusion, reconciliation and decolonization.
- Flexibility to work varying hours, including evenings and weekends, to accommodate project schedules.
- Legal authorization to work in Canada.
- Criminal record check may be required.
- Physical ability to perform tasks involving extended periods of standing, walking, moving supplies or equipment weighing up to 20 pounds, and activities requiring bending or stooping.

Experience, skills, and attributes:

- Reflective awareness of how personal lived experiences with systemic barriers or privileges shape unique contributions to social change.
- Curiosity to explore many kinds of work that support community climate action.
- Excellent communication skills, and experience engaging with diverse community members in diverse settings..
- Adaptable and adventurous mindset, comfortable navigating ambiguity and change.

- Proficiency in using G-Suite (Google Apps), Microsoft Office, basic databases, video conferencing tools, social media platforms, and other relevant applications.
- Knowledge of or work experience in areas such as climate change, anti-oppression work, food security, energy, forestry, and climate justice is an asset.
- Standard First Aid certification or higher is an asset, training may be provided.
- Driver's license is an asset.

Application Process:

Interested candidates are asked to complete their application by midnight (PST) on **Sunday, May 31** by:

1. Clicking the "**Apply Now**" button and uploading a resume.
2. **Submitting a video introduction** (about 3 minutes) to people@youthclimatecorps.com with the subject line: *Mobilizer Application [location]*, letting us know:
 - Why are you curious to explore different kinds of community climate action work through this position?
 - What strengths and/or skills do you bring to this work?

We're interested in what you have to say, not how polished your video is. Production quality will not factor into our assessment. If you prefer a different format, we're happy to accommodate.

Candidates selected for an interview will be notified the week of June 1, 2026 with interviews taking place between June 22-26.

YCCBC strives to create a safe, accessible, and anti-oppressive environment where people can show up fully and contribute meaningfully to climate justice. We value lived experience and encourage applications from individuals and communities who have been historically excluded or marginalized.

Applicant screening and AI use:

Applications are first screened in the Rise platform using AI to check whether minimum requirements and eligibility criteria are met.
