The Secwepemc Health Caucus (SHC) is looking for a SHC Traditional Wellness Coordinator to support the development, implementation and on-going delivery of land-based, cultural healing services for individuals and families based on Nation health and wellness plans and goals. This is a full-time, term position ending on March 31, 2024 with the possibility for extension contingent on secured funding.

Relevant Knowledge and Abilities

- Ability to effectively prioritize and execute multiple tasks simultaneously in a high-pressure environment while maintaining effectiveness and efficiency;
- Build Relationships, establish and maintain positive working relationships with others, both internally and externally, to achieve the goals of the organization;
- Program coordination experience or a combination of education, training and experience;
- Ability to develop and document work plans, including ongoing adaptation and reporting;
- Knowledge of provincial and federal health systems, and First Nations health system needs;
- Experience working with Traditional Elders, Healers, and Knowledge Keepers, as well as First Nation communities.

Requirements and Qualifications:

- A minimum of 2 years of post-secondary training in a relevant field is preferred; Indigenous Studies, Anthropology, Sociology, Social Work, Human Services or an acceptable combination of education, training, and experience acceptable;
- Strong analytical, communication skills (verbal and written) and Program coordination experience or a combination of education, training and experience;
- Strongly familiar with Secwepemc culture and traditions;
- Ability to efficiently and effectively utilize Microsoft Office Suite including Word, Outlook, PowerPoint and Excel;
- Must be able to work flexible hours and travel as required;
- Possess a valid driver's license with a reliable vehicle.

In accordance with the SNTC Human Resource Policy, the first priority will be to hire qualified persons of Secwepemc ancestry. Pursuant to section 41 of the BC Human Rights Code, preference may be given to applicants of Aboriginal ancestry.
